

Noel O'Neill's journey began in Ireland but his passion for the performing arts led him to New York in his late teens.

There, he honed his craft under the tutelage of legends Lee Strasberg and Herbert Berghof, appearing in off-Broadway productions of *One Flew Over The Cuckoo's Nest* and *Of Mice and Men*.

A new chapter in Perth

More than 20 years ago, Noel relocated to Perth, where he has since become a cornerstone of the local theatre scene. His exceptional contributions have earned him numerous awards for both writing and directing.

Beyond the stage, he has imparted his knowledge to aspiring actors as a lecturer at the WA Academy of Performing Arts and Perth Actors' Collective.

On-screen presence

Noel's versatility extends to the screen with memorable roles such as Watto in the ABC-TV series *The Heights* and Dennis Glennon in *The Claremont Murders*. These performances have showcased his remarkable range and ability to captivate audiences.

Park bench play appeal Why Noel keeps returning to the idea

Noel is perhaps best known for his "park bench plays". Centred around a park bench, these plays strip down theatrical production to its core elements – storytelling and performance, lauded for their ability to blend humour with pathos.

"I sat in a park years ago in New York and it amazed me what was happening on each bench," Noel said. "There were couples arguing, meeting for the first time, people cheating on their spouses and those who were down and out.



Simplicity is key

"By just using a park bench, it seemed to be the simplest

way to tell a story – I've never been one to be amazed by a theatrical set and keeping it simple has been a lifelong lesson.

"I like the idea of the park bench plays because I feel the audience joins the characters, as if they are eavesdropping. I'm sure there is a connection with the audience – I have always found theatre reflects life more than the cinema. Audiences can see a little bit of themselves in some of the characters and empathise and laugh at the situations people get themselves into."
